BioBuilder's **Learning Lab Partnership Director** will be responsible for program development and capacity building of our teaching lab that will open in Spring 2017. Our Partnership Director will ensure the smooth execution of BioBuilder's existing programming. The Director will also initiate, analyze and execute new relationships, programs and collaborations. Effective communication of the ongoing work and the success of our efforts is an essential component of this job.



The **Learning Lab Partnership Director** does not need to be familiar with synthetic biology or BioBuilder in advance (though it is a plus), but must be an energetic, creative and organized individual who is both goal- and detail-oriented. Motivation, enthusiasm, an ability to take constructive criticism and excellent communication skills are essential.

Applicants should have a passion for education, a positive history of working with a team, and an extensive resume of project management experience, clearly demonstrating initiative in some academic or non-academic forum. This position is ideal for an experienced team leader with insight into education reform and an interest in laboratory science. The position could be equally well filled by a trained scientist with direct experience in community/outreach education and a talent for business management. An experienced educator who has worked in biotech or as an entrepreneur is also a possible fit.

The **Learning Lab Partnership Director** is a permanent staff position in our organization that reports directly to the Executive Director of The BioBuilder Educational Foundation and will oversee the Laboratory Teaching Fellows. The Director will work at LabCentral in Kendall Square, but will be required to collaborate extensively with BioBuilder's remote operating and programming staff. This position will begin as part-time work in February 2017, with conversion to full-time work no later than July 2017.
